Since I was a child, I have helped my mother with work in the fields such as harvesting, growing vegetables, raising chickens, and selling vegetables at the market.

For me, the scholarship has been a great source of financial support to my family which helped us overcome challenges in life and enabled me to pursue my passion and dreams. It has also provided me with spiritual support which helps me realise my own values and makes me aware of contributing to society.

Being a student at Lifestart Foundation, I have had the opportunity to listen to, share and understand unfortunate lives, encouraging me to keep moving ahead and devote all my energies and wisdom to society. Our Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship recipient, Nhung, recently completed her final year of high school and has been accepted into the University of Finance & Marketing (Ho Chi Minh City), where she will major in Marketing. Nhung's journey is particularly remarkable as she has been a scholarship recipient since Year 8, and this opportunity has truly changed her life. Being the first in her family to attend university adds even more significance to her achievements.

At the conclusion of Year 12, Nhung achieved an impressive overall score of 26.35 out of 30, with notable scores of 9.2 in English and 8.75 in Literature in the National High School

Graduation Exam. Like all of our scholarship students, Nhung continues to inspire us with her determination and accomplishments, despite the significant challenges she faces.

Nhung hails from a disadvantaged family of four, including her grandparents and her mother. Prior to receiving the invaluable Lifestart Foundation Education Scholarship, her family faced numerous obstacles. Nhung's mother, a single parent, works as a tailor during the day and makes pork rolls at night to supplement her income. The scholarship covers Nhung's tuition fees, books, uniforms, supplies, and all the necessary additional classes to support her education. This support has brought about a positive transformation in their lives, providing them with financial relief and a renewed sense of hope for Nhung's future.

Despite the challenges posed by her disadvantaged background, Nhung has consistently demonstrated herself to be an exceptional student, earning the title of an excellent student for many years. In addition to attending regular school classes, she dedicates a remarkable 7-8 hours per day to self-study and devotes nearly the entire day to studying in the days leading up to exams. As a result of her unwavering commitment and hard work, in Year 12, she achieved an impressive GPA of 9.3 out of 10 and successfully passed the National High School Graduation Exam, which paved the way for her acceptance into the University of Finance & Marketing in Ho Chi Minh City.

Nhung is a well-rounded student, and besides studying, she is also actively engaged in extracurricular activities. She contributed to the local fight against Covid-19, visiting and distributing gifts to the community in the mountainous district of Nam Tra My, Quang Nam

Thu hails from a financially disadvantaged family of four, including her mother, elder brother, sister, and herself.



My name is Ha Thi Dieu, a recent graduate in English Language from the University of Foreign Language Studies, University of Danang. Today, I am writing this letter to share with you all my recent study achievements, my family's life, and my plans for the future. Also, I would like to express my deepest gratitude to you both and everyone at Lifestart Foundation for the invaluable support you have provided to me and my family throughout the scholarship period.

In terms of my studies, as I had completed most of my specialized subjects in third year, I only had a two-credit Graduation Internship module to complete in the first semester of year 4. This period was profoundly meaningful for me as I had the incredible opportunity to undertake an 8-week internship at Lifestart Foundation. During this time, I applied the knowledge and skills I had acquired over the past three years to real-world situations. I also gained a deeper understanding of the noble work carried out by Lifestart Foundation. I successfully completed the internship, achieving an A level mark with a GPA of 9.8 out of a possible 10.

Following the internship, I dedicated all of my free time every day to preparing for the IELTS exam. I followed my study plan, focusing on at least two skills a day, with a minimum of 4 hours for each skill. During the rest of my free time, I worked on solving the tests in Cambridge reference books. In February 2023, I took the exam and achieved my target score of 7.0 in IELTS. As I am not completely satisfied with this result, I am determined to continue enhancing my English skills in the future.

Looking back on the past four years, I am delighted to inform you that I graduated with a GPA of 3.67 out of a possible 4.0, earning the title of High Distinction. This achievement fills me with joy and satisfaction, motivating me to continue to improve in the future through constant learning and development of my skills every day.

I am thrilled to share that after completing my internship, I applied for a formal position at the Lifestart Foundation, realizing my long-held dream of working in the NGO sector. I started my probation period in May 2023 and officially joined the organization in July. During the probation period, I was involved in various tasks related to the organization's communications, participated



in donation trips, translated letters from scholarship students, and taught English to some of Lifestart Foundation's scholarship recipients. I am immensely grateful for the warm support and guidance provided by Lifestart Foundation's staff especially during challenging moments, and when adapting to the professional environment. Working here is a truly valuable and fulfilling experience because I have had the opportunity to engage in meaningful and practical tasks. For many years, I had nurtured thoughts about working in a non-governmental organization after graduation, as it would allow me to contribute my efforts to the community. Outside of working hours, I dedicate my free time to self-study, focusing on improving my English language skills and learning relevant skills such as writing, design, and photo and video editing using applications such as Lightroom, Photoshop, and Premiere. I also spend time revising the skills that I have been instructed in at work. In the future, I plan to continue self-learning these skills in order to become proficient in various applications, saving time with practical tasks.

Reflecting on the past, it has been seven years since I started receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship. At that time, my family faced numerous difficulties as my mother's health deteriorated, making it challenging for her to continue working. We relied on the income she earned from farming work and grass cutting. Early in the morning at 6 o'clock, my mother went to work. She didn't return home until 12 o'clock noon, and then she went back to work at 1 o'clock in the afternoon and didn't come back until late in the evening. For her work, she was paid 25,000 VND for one day, and sometimes they didn't pay her on time. I vividly remember my mother's worries and struggles during those days when she didn't know how to continue to support my studies. She believed that education was essential for a child's future, especially in a rapidly growing society.

During my secondary school years, I diligently studied and participated in contests to win books, gifts that would help reduce the burden of having to purchase study materials. I never imagined attending university; my goal was merely to continue studying until circumstances forced me to stop then I could either become a manual worker or a farmer. Then, a turning point arrived. My form teacher provided me with a scholarship application form. Although I had applied several times before without success, I submitted the form again in the 9th grade, thinking it would be my last attempt. At that time, I still didn't know the criteria for becoming a scholarship student. To my surprise, I received a call informing me of an interview one evening after school in 2016. I succeeded in the interview, receiving a certificate confirming my scholarship. This moment marked a significant change in my life. The scholarship not only provided me with essential study materials such as books, stationery and clothes but also daily essentials, bicycles, electric bikes, and electronic devices for study such as a tablet and a laptop. It was the first time I had all the necessary study resources. These were things that I never imagined having a chance to use one day. My mother and I were deeply moved and grateful for the gestures of kindness and encouragement from people that we had only met once or twice, or hadn't even met before, which made us burst into tears many times. During those completely hazy and uncertain days, the scholarship came and ignited a flame within me, lighting my path and warming my journey toward a brighter future.

When I received the scholarship, the financial burden on my family significantly reduced. My mother was able to focus more on household chores, growing vegetables for our daily meals and



selling lemongrass to earn additional income. We now enjoyed better nutrition, and my mother could devote more time to our well-being, without having to work long hours as she did before. I could concentrate fully on my studies, attend extra classes, and participate in high-quality university exam preparation courses. I had the opportunity to attend career orientation days organized by Lifestart Foundation which helped me gain experience and knowledge not typically accessible to someone of my age. I am incredibly fortunate that Lifestart Foundation continued to support my education through university. This support enabled me to focus on my studies, maintain good academic results, make new friends, improve myself daily, and eventually secure stable employment.

Occasionally, my mother and I wonder, "What would our life be like now if there had been no scholarship?" Without it, I might not have been able to attend university. I would have likely started working in low-paid manual jobs to support my family, and my mother would have continued struggling to make ends meet. I would have missed the opportunity to learn new things, to acquire knowledge at the university, and to explore new horizons. Most importantly, without the scholarship, I would not have met all of the kind-hearted individuals who gave me precious gifts, supported and motivated me, and encouraged me in my studies and my life every step of the way. One thing is certain: without the assistance provided by Lifestart Foundation, I would not become the person I am today.

Throughout my educational journey supported by Lifestart Foundation, I am profoundly grateful for the unwavering assistance. Through this final letter, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks for funding my scholarship, and for your continued care, help, and updates on my progress over the past seven years. My journey at Danang University of Education has come to a successful conclusion. During the last semester, a classmate and I collaborated on our graduation project titled "Designing a Website for Selling Clothes." We encountered various challenges along the way but persevered and completed it on time, although there were some shortcomings. I dedicated approximately 8 to 9 hours every day to home study, and my classmate and I constantly discussed and analyzed our progress. Initially, we faced difficulties in writing the report and implementing specific website



functions. To overcome these challenges, we sought assistance from our instructor and friends who helped us find solutions. Our four years of friendship as classmates played a significant role in supporting and motivating us to successfully complete the project.

On July 5, 2023, I graduated.

I am currently employed as a Fresher at FPT Software to gain practical experience. In the future, I plan to further enhance my knowledge in Java programming to enhance my job prospects.

Before receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, my family faced numerous hardships. Our primary source of income was my father, who worked as a bricklayer. Unfortunately, he suffered from epilepsy, which limited his ability to work and resulted in meager earnings. My mother managed our land and vegetable cultivation at home but had no income. At that time, we were categorized as an impoverished household. Both my parents worked tirelessly to support and educate the four of us. My two older sisters were attending college, I was in Year 7, and my younger brother had just started Year 1. Due to frequent illnesses, my parents could not provide us with favorable conditions for education. My friends attended summer courses and additional classes to gain more knowledge, and I longed for a similar opportunity. However, due to our financial difficulties, my parents could only afford to pay for my school tuition fees, and my mother borrowed used textbooks from older students for me to study with, instead of purchasing new ones.

During Year 7, Lifestart Foundation visited my school to interview potential scholarship recipients. As a financially disadvantaged student who faced challenging circumstances but exhibited exceptional dedication to academic excellence, I was fortunate enough to be selected for an interview. After participating in two interviews, I was overwhelmed with gratitude upon being awarded a Lifestart Foundation scholarship. At that moment, no words could adequately express my feelings. You opened a new door of hope for me on my educational journey and alleviated some of the burdens on my parents' shoulders. Together with my mother on her Honda Super Cup 50 motorcycle, I gradually became familiar with the route to the Lifestart Foundation office. Before receiving the Lifestart Foundation education scholarship, I faced financial difficulties regarding my education. Growing up in a farming family with unstable economic conditions and with two other sisters also attending school, it was impossible for us to have a computer for studying or go to extra classes. At that time, although I desired to acquire comprehensive knowledge, I chose not to pursue extra classes to avoid burdening my parents with these extra expenses on top of their daily living costs. With the encouragement from my family, relatives, and my own passion for education, along with the dream of securing a stable job to support my family, I was motivated to strive for academic excellence every day, never once considering giving up. I self-studied entirely using textbooks and borrowed study materials from my friends, photocopying and studying them. I maintained a record of outstanding academic achievements and ranked among the top students in my class every academic year.

At the end of year 9, my form teacher introduced me to the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, and I applied with the hope that it would facilitate my education journey. Fortunately, after several interviews, I was selected as a scholarship recipient of Lifestart Foundation starting from year 10 and have received the scholarship for seven years now. Upon receiving news of being awarded the Lifestart scholarship, my family was overjoyed and deeply grateful to Lifestart Foundation.

If it weren't for the support of the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, I believe it would have been challenging for me to maintain a good academic performance until now. Having to manage financial burdens such as tuition fees, meals, transportation, and accommodation away from home would have required me to work part-time, preventing me from fully focusing on my studies. Thanks to the support in all aspects from the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, I have been able to dedicate myself to studying and devote all my time to learning and personal development.

Despite the company being situated around 300 kilometers from my home town, I have secured a room just 5 kilometers from the office. While I anticipate challenges in this new environment, I am fully committed to surmounting them and excelling in my role. In the future, I intend to further enrich my professional expertise by delving deeper into Automation Testing. Furthermore, I am resolute in advancing my proficiency in both Japanese and English, recognizing that improved language skills will open doors for career growth.

Before being granted the scholarship from Lifestart Foundation, my family confronted numerous hardships. My father's illness prevented him from working, placing a significant burden on my mother who tirelessly provided for us. She bore a double workload due to my father's inability to work, toiling in the fields during the day, tending to tasks such as planting, weeding, and fertilizing vegetables. During the evenings, she would sell the produce at the market to generate income. It was during this period that I contemplated forgoing university after high school to seek employment and support my mother. Initially, I had considered securing a job at a nearby factory to contribute financially and assist my mother in maintaining our family.

Observing my mother's unwavering determination, I grew increasingly concerned about her declining health. I was deeply motivated to alleviate the financial burden she bore and not add to her responsibilities by seeking education.

Thankfully, I was among the fortunate recipients chosen for the scholarship. As with all of our scholarship students, Trieu has a difficult backstory which he explains in his letter of gratitude below.

Trieu hails from a financially challenged family of 3, including his sister, his niece, and himself. Unfortunately, both of his



parents lost their lives to cancer several years ago. Trieu's sister was in an unhappy marriage, so she returned to their parents' small home and embarked on a new life with her four-year-old daughter, to ensure she could provide care and support for Trieu and her daughter.

To make ends meet, Trieu's sister works part-time and earns a meagre income of only 2,500,000 VND (approximately \$103 USD) per month, which has to cover the entire family's living expenses.

With such a disadvantaged situation, Trieu was unable to attend any supplementary classes. However, he still achieved a very good GPA of 8.6 out of a possible 10 in Year 8, which left a lasting impression during his interview process.

Currently, Trieu's ambition is to pursue a career as a programmer, and the Lifestart Foundation scholarship will play a crucial role in turning this dream into a reality.

Since being awarded the full scholarship, Trieu's life has undergone a significant transformation. The scholarship has alleviated an enormous financial burden from both him and his sister. It covers all of Trieu's educational expenses, including tuition fees, books, uniforms, and stationery. Additionally, the scholarship provides him with the opportunity to enrol in important extra classes that will further enhance his education.

Afterward, I assist my sister with household chores, taking care of her daughter, cleaning, and cooking.

In the upcoming year, my goal is to improve my academic performance from the previous year and enhance my IT skills, particularly in programming.

Since learning about computers at school and watching TV programs, I have aspired to become a programmer, software engineer, designer, or developer, contributing to the world of computer software. Just like an orchestral conductor shaping a musical piece, a programmer crafts code to create perfect software melodies. They work across various programming languages, building and designing websites. These passions fuel my desire to contribute creatively by developing programs that advance national technology. Moreover, I hope to secure a well-paying job to alleviate my sister's financial strain.

When I applied for the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, my shy and reserved nature, left me apprehensive. However, I committed to giving my best effort to secure the scholarship and assist my sister with our daily expenses. The interview process was friendly and comfortable, enabling me to speak about myself. Upon receiving news of the scholarship, my sister and I were overwhelmed with happiness.

This scholarship is the first of its kind for me, enabling me to continue my education. I felt an immense sense of excitement, happiness, and gratitude. Luck had truly smiled upon me, delivering the best news I could have hoped for.

HIEN'S GRATITUDE LETTER:

Dear everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Nguyen Thai Hien, and I have been a fortunate recipient of your kind sponsorship for the past years. Recently, I graduated in English from Danang University of Foreign Language Studies. This is a special letter, because I am no longer a student but a graduate and a member of staff at Lifestart Foundation.

Via this letter, I would like to tell you about my current life as well as what I have been through.

After completing the second semester of my fourth year, due to the kindness of Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation, I was able to work as an intern with Lifestart Foundation, which helped me to mature. I have gained knowledge in the field of English translation as well as skills such as computer skills and time management; I have been assigned various tasks that have helped me become more proactive. Because everyone understands that I am a fresh graduate, Karen, Nhung, and the other staff members here have been very supportive, guiding me in every small detail and important task. Everyone is united, and I feel a warm sense of belonging as if it is my second home. I feel truly lucky to receive the care, support and love from you all, Karen, and the staff at Lifestart Foundation.

After completing the internship, I achieved the highest GPA of 4.0/4.0. In my specialized courses, I studied Advanced Translation and Interpreting and Marketing, to which I dedicated a lot of time to study for the final exams. I spent 8-9 hours every day practicing interpreting skills and searching for English videos on YouTube to listen to and translate. I found this method to be effective and beneficial as it helped me learn new vocabulary and gain new knowledge. As for Marketing, I worked with my group on a project to design and advertise a product. Our group planned and executed the project immediately after receiving the topic. We created and filmed a promotional video, completed the project report, and prepared thoroughly for the presentation. As a result, our group received praise from the teacher and did better than other groups in the class. I achieved a perfect GPA of 4.0/4.0 for the second semester. With my efforts throughout the learning process, I graduated with a Credit degree, not as good as I had hoped, but when I look back at what I have done and the effort I have made, I feel very satisfied.

Time flies so quickly. It feels like just yesterday I was a nervous freshman at university, but now I have graduated. Everything seems so recent, from when I was an orphaned girl with only my older brother, who was in high school, as my only family. Our lives were uncertain and without a future. We relied on our aunt and uncle for food and to continue going to school like other children. I remember at that time, there were six people in my uncle's family, including himself, his wife, three cousins, and my cousin's wife. He did not have a stable job, and the whole family depended on their small café, but the business was struggling because the café was located in a quiet rural area. My brother and I added to the financial burden on my uncle's shoulders, and I felt truly sad and pressured during that time. They even considered sending me to an orphanage feeling unable to support me.



I had always dreamed of having a warm and loving family, with a mother to take care of me like my peers. And that dream came true when I met Karen and received the invaluable Lifestart Foundation scholarship. The scholarship came at the exact moment when I was utterly in need, serving as a warm flame lighting up hope within me. I still vividly remember the day when the school informed me to come for an interview. I was interviewed by Karen, who sat across from me, looking at me with gentle eyes and a warm smile, just like my mother's smile that I had not seen in a long time. She asked me many questions about my life and encouraged me to strive hard to study. I was deeply moved and cried a lot during the interview. A few days after the interview, I received the news that I had been awarded the scholarship, which made me overwhelmed with joy. The scholarship has given me new hope for my life. I shared the news with my uncle and everyone was overjoyed and congratulated me. I truly cannot forget that moment.

Thanks to the scholarship, my life has turned into one full of promise. Since receiving the scholarship, I have been provided with all study-related costs such as extra classes, uniforms, shoes, tuition fees, annual study equipment, a laptop, accommodation, living expenses and other costs until I graduated. Furthermore, the scholarship has alleviated the burden on my uncle's shoulders. In times of natural disasters such as floods, I received essential supplies from the Lifestart Foundation, including salt, sugar, toothpaste, shampoo, rice, etc., to use during difficult days. Additionally, I was given a bicycle to commute to school like other students. I also participated in the day-out events to relieve stress after long and tiring hours of studying at school, along with other scholarship students. When I was in Year 11, I moved back home, but Ms Karen was afraid that no one would take care of me, so she allowed me to stay at her house. I feel very fortunate and grateful to her. During my stay with her, she took care of all my needs, from food and living expenses to everything else. She always took me to eat delicious meals and bought me various things, from a hairdryer, a pillow, and a school bag to clothes. The time I stayed with her was extremely happy because she cared for me like my mother which left me full of warmth and touch.

I was also lucky to have Lifestart Foundation volunteers, Ms. Jill from Australia, and Ms. Sue fro the UK teach me English. They taught me many valuable lessons, and thanks to them, my English has improved significantly. They always brought positive energy and joy to our study sessions, helping me prepare for IELTS, introducing me to relevant IELTS materials and helping me improve my pronunciation. As a result, I became more confident in my communication skills. The scholarship has greatly improved my life. I have better study conditions, the opportunity to pursue additional education, learn English, and have all the necessities like other students, without worrying about borrowing money to attend university. I am truly touched and cannot fully express my gratitude to everyone for my scholarship and the support I have received. Despite coming from different countries and being complete strangers, everyone at Lifestart Foundation has always been ready to help me and support my journey towards success. It is a great support that I can never forget in my lifetime.

Now looking back at the past, I cannot believe I have overcome everything so smoothly. Even now, I cannot believe where I am today. If I had not received the scholarship, I truly could not imagine that I would be able to continue studying until university, graduate, and pursue my



dreams. Without the help of everyone and the Lifestart Foundation, I might have had to work as a laborer like my older brother and many other friends who did not have the opportunity to study.

I have now been accepted by Ms. Karen as a full-time employee for the Lifestart Foundation as Education Scholarship and Administration Officer. I have always admired the work that Ms. Karen and the other staff members have done at the Lifestart Foundation. This job has been like a dream, full of human significance, for me. Through this job, I have come to understand the value of giving, which is to bring joy to others. Sometimes, helping someone is not just about providing material possessions, but also about offering spiritual support, and allowing us to comprehend the difficulties and hardships that others face. Translating thank-you letters from students, participating in volunteer activities to distribute gifts in mountainous areas with the Lifestart Foundation, and witnessing situations that are even harder than those I experienced in the past, have given me countless unnamed and indescribable emotions. I cherish my current life, have a stronger determination to strive and remind myself to continuously improve and fulfill my role. In the future, I hope I can contribute something to the community, just you and everyone at the Lifestart Foundation have done.

Before receiving the precious Lifestart Foundation Medical Scholarship, Linh's family's monthly income was only 5,000,000 VND or approximately \$217 USD per month, which made it extremely difficult for her parents to manage their daily living expenses while having to support Linh with six years of university studies. LINH'S GRATITUDE LETTER:

Dear Karen and Everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

Firstly, I'd like to extend my heartfelt greetings to the Lifestart Foundation scholarship sponsors, Karen, and all the members of the organization. I am Doan Thi Thuy Linh, a recent graduate in General Medicine from Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. Time has passed quickly; it feels like just yesterday when I hesitantly stepped into Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy, and now I stand here as a new doctor, about to leave the familiar halls of this institution. Today, I am filled with immense gratitude for the opportunity that Lifestart Foundation has given me.

Last semester included 2 clinical subjects: Internal Medicine and Surgery. As a final-year student, most of my time was spent on clinical training at hospitals. The period leading up to the graduation exam was intense and I had only one month for revision. Over six years, I've undergone countless exams both big and small. However, facing the decisive exam for medical students, my peers and I couldn't help but feel a bit anxious. The graduation exam was divided into three parts: basic theoretical exam, clinical theory, and clinical practice. Each section included several subjects comprising an extensive amount of knowledge such as Anatomy, Physiology, Epidemiology Internal Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics, and Paediatrics. That's why we had to study diligently, ensuring we covered everything. After studying for 10-12 hours a day during that period, I successfully completed the exams with the results I desired. I scored an A grade with 9.1 out of a possible 10 in the basic theoretical exam, a result that reflected my dedicated preparation. During the clinical exams, I was assigned to the Obstetrics department.

I ended the second semester of my sixth year with a GPA of 3.21 out of a possible 4.0. Over the six years, my cumulative GPA was 3.30 out of 4, and I had the honor of receiving a Distinction



degree in General Medicine from Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. I was overjoyed because my six years of hard work at the university and in hospitals have been truly rewarded. Although this is just the beginning of my medical journey, it is an important milestone for me. After the final exams, we had a month-long practical training at local hospitals. I was assigned to the General Internal Medicine department at Quang Tri Provincial General Hospital.

Now, I have graduated, and have officially become a doctor, marking the end of my student life at the Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. Initially, I planned to take the Residency exam, but considering my financial situation, the resources I have available to me, and the time factor I have decided to seek employment and pursue further studies later. The cost of the postgraduate program is significant and beyond my family's financial capacity. Therefore, I intend to work and help ease some of the financial burdens on my family. Six years at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy have taught me that the medical field is vast, and what I have learned is just a grain of sand in the desert. My six years at university have come to an end. I have come a long way since the early days when I stumbled into the university environment trying to adjust to new learning methods, then gradually becoming accustomed to the rhythm of studying there. I am the first member of my family to attend university. My elder brother, who is five years older than me, graduated from a vocational school, but he struggled to find stable employment. I vividly remember the day I received my acceptance letter. My mother was overjoyed, and tears welled up in her eyes. My less expressive father showed pride in his eyes. Carrying the dreams of youth and aspiring to become a doctor, I went to Hue for a university education on a hot day at the end of summer. At that time, in addition to hope and happiness, I also worried about the tuition fees, which would be a considerable burden on my parents.

I vividly recall a day in late April 2019 when I returned home for the April 30th holiday. My father was out clearing grass in the forest and my mother and I were preparing dinner. My father returned home with a bloodshot left eye, injured by a piece of flying wood while operating a grass-cutting machine. Despite surgery, his eye never fully recovered, and he lost nearly all vision in his left eye. From being the primary breadwinner, my father could no longer work far away and had to avoid strenuous outdoor activities. Our balanced life became uncertain, and my mother's worry wrinkles deepened. At times, I wondered whether, if the financial commitment to my education wasn't there, my parents would suffer less? However, looking into my parents' hopeful and proud eyes, I couldn't allow myself to give up. In the second semester of that academic year, I achieved a GPA of 3.88 out of 4.0.

One day, I received an interview invitation from the Lifestart Foundation in Hoi An. Unfortunately, I felt unwell due to car sickness on the way there. I was nervous as it was my first interview, but with encouragement from Karen and Nhung, I gained confidence. I remember Karen's kind smile and her empathy and understanding when she heard about my family's situation. Though separated by a computer screen, her image remains etched in my mind until now. In that room, there were many paintings, one of which had the words: "Always believe that something wonderful is about to happen." That statement left a strong impression on me, adding an unnamed strength and an unending faith within me. When I received the news that I had been awarded the scholarship, I was truly overwhelmed: tears of joy streamed down my face, but they were tears of



happiness. Thank you, Lifestart Foundation, for allowing me to start a new life, and a brighter future.

The Lifestart Foundation scholarship holds immense significance for me and my family. The scholarship not only provides material support but also invaluable spiritual encouragement. The scholarship has helped me overcome challenges in life and pay tuition fees more easily, lightening the financial burden on my parents' fragile shoulders. Thanks to the support from Lifestart Foundation, besides covering tuition fees and daily expenses, I was able to buy more reference books, aiding my learning process. The scholarship also serves as a great motivation source for me to strive harder in my studies. It constantly reminds me that I must continue to make efforts and never stop trying to prepare for the future. I am truly grateful for the support from the organization. I'd also like to thank Ms. Uyen for accompanying me over the years and motivating, understanding, and guiding me whenever I felt lost. There were moments when academic pressures overwhelmed me, but those meetings with her brought me back to reality, reminding me that I had to try even harder, maintain good academic performance to meet the scholarship requirements, and accumulate a wider range of knowledge.

Apart from myself, the Lifestart Foundation scholarship has also considerably impacted my family. It is an achievement of mine that our entire family is proud of. I am genuinely thankful and appreciate the opportunity that the Lifestart Foundation scholarship has given me, allowing me to develop myself to reach the final stage of my university journey. I have achieved my goal of graduating with honors, with a cumulative GPA of 3.30 for the entire course. If it were not for the scholarship, I believe my student life would have been much more difficult. For my family during that period, household expenses, medical bills, and my allowance would have been an enormous burden. I would have faced financial pressure, unable to cover my living expenses, especially the tuition fees. Certainly, my parents would have had to borrow more money to support me, and the debt would have increased day by day. The scholarship has indeed had a significant impact on me, influencing my motivation and spirit. Both my sister and I wanted to make our parents as proud as possible and eventually to alleviate some of their burdens.

Although this might not be an outstanding achievement, I am satisfied because I have always tried my best. Currently, I am working at the same company where I interned as a BrSE. This is a job I have always dreamed of during my university years. Although I lack experience and face many challenges, my colleagues in the company are always there to help me complete my tasks. I will continue to enhance my knowledge and skills to excel in my job. Outside of working hours, I plan to read more specialized IT-related books in Japanese to advance my career.

Looking back to 5 years ago, graduating from university and having a job like I do now seemed like a distant dream. Pursuing education in my economically struggling hometown was challenging, especially when my family was still facing financial hardships.

Before receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, my family faced extreme hardships. My mother, a single parent, raised me since my childhood alone, but sadly, she passed away from cancer when I was in the 5th grade. During that time, my grandmother as well as my aunt and my



uncle took care of me. My grandmother, despite her old age, still grew vegetables to sell in the market daily, and my visually impaired uncle milled rice every day to earn a living for our family. My aunt sold fertilized duck eggs at the market nearby our house and raised chickens and ducks to sell in her free time. We barely made ends meet, only enough to cover study expenses for my cousins and myself. There were times of illness, times when we had to borrow money to pay for our education. We lived in a makeshift house that couldn't protect us from rain or sun, and during floods or storms, we lived in constant fear of our home collapsing.

One of the things I am extremely grateful for is the love, care, and support I received from my teachers at Chu Van An High School, who always created the best possible learning conditions for me. Fortunately, then I received an invaluable gift - the opportunity to receive a scholarship from the Lifestart Foundation. And the turning point that has totally changed my life was when I was chosen as one of the scholarship recipients by the Lifestart Foundation, thanks to the recommendation from my form teacher and the Youth Union Secretary of Chu Van An High School. This valuable scholarship covered all my study and living expenses. My family was in need, so when I heard the news of receiving the scholarship, I felt incredibly happy. Even now, thinking back, I still feel overjoyed. journey, I mainly studied on my own, using borrowed books and I lacked access to extra classes and resources, including limited Internet. Fortunately, through excellent medical attention, his health has gradually stabilized, and he now shows signs of recovery. Although he is unable to work, he can manage light household chores independently, alleviating some of the family's worries and restoring a semblance of happiness. However, he still needs regular health check-ups and continuous medication every three months.

The generous and practical support provided by Lifestart Foundation in various aspects of my life, including tuition fees, living expenses, laptops, books, and networking opportunities with fellow scholarship recipients, has assisted me greatly in my academic life. Therefore, I express my heartfelt gratitude for the timely guidance, encouragement, and aid extended by Lifestart Foundation. Your invaluable assistance has eased our financial burden, allowing me to concentrate on my studies and academic growth.

Without the caring support of Lifestart Foundation, my family would have encountered immense hardship and struggled to provide for my education. My name is Le Thi Thi Loan, a newly graduated General Medicine student from Hue University of Medicine. Over the past four years, with the help of Mrs. Karen and everyone at Lifestart



Foundation, I have been able to overcome the difficulties in my academic journey, for which I am immensely grateful.

Last semester marked the final year of my university studies. I worked harder than ever before, with the hope of achieving better grades and performing well in my future career after graduation. Throughout the year, I dedicated most of my time to clinical practice in various fields such as Internal Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics, and Pediatrics. At the end of the second semester, I successfully defended my dissertation, an accomplishment that made me immensely proud. QUYNH'S GRATITUDE LETTER:

Dear Ms. Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Phan Thi Nhu Quynh, a newly graduated medical student from Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy. I am writing this letter to share the results I have achieved in the last semester, as well as my upcoming plans.

In the second semester, I studied Internal and External Medicine and worked on my graduation thesis. As usual, my study schedule was quite busy. I spent the entire day at the clinic, followed by night watch duty in the evenings. Additionally, during my clinic hours, I dedicated time to collecting data at the Centre for Reproductive and Fertility Endocrinology for my graduate thesis. The focus of my thesis was "Studies on depression, anxiety, and stress using the DASS-21 scale in infertility cases."

Every day, apart from my clinic duties, I devoted 4 to 5 hours of my free time in the evenings to self-study and review for my resident doctor exam. I am pleased to share that my second-semester GPA was 3.71 out of 4.0. Last June, I successfully defended my graduation thesis and achieved a score of 9.3/10, which is an accomplishment I am very happy with. I am glad that my hard work over the past year has paid off. Additionally, I actively participated in other university activities, including reporting on scientific research.

I graduated with a bachelor's degree and earned a cumulative GPA of 3.55 out of 4.0. I am happy with this result, as I have always put in my best effort throughout my academic journey.

Before receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, my family faced immense difficulties. My father suffers from osteoarthritis of the knee, which prevented him from working. He used to be a carpenter, often climbing onto people's roofs to repair them, and this demanding work took a toll on his health. My mother also has a degenerative spine condition and gallbladder problems. Despite their illnesses and challenging circumstances, my parents ignored their illnesses and still prioritized funding my university education. My younger brother had a cleft lip and cleft palate, which required surgery, and he still experiences related health issues. Since my father's knee condition worsened and he lost his source of income, the burden has fallen on my mother's



shoulders. Her monthly salary of about 3 million VND is barely enough to support both myself and my sibling, who is also attending school. I am aware of my family's significant hardships, which is why I constantly strive to excel academically to bring happiness to my parents. However, due to the distance between my school and home, I had to rent a room in a hostel, and I couldn't visit my family frequently due to a busy schedule and expensive travel costs. At times, I felt sad and helpless because I was unable to improve my family's living conditions.

When I received an email announcing the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, I prepared the papers and completed the application form. When I received an email from Lifestart Foundation that I had passed the application round, I was very happy. The hope in me re-ignited. On the day of the scholarship interview, I was nervous and trembling. However, after interacting with Mrs. Karen and sharing my story with her about my family's situation and my dreams and plans, I felt more at ease.

Receiving the Lifestart Foundation scholarship overwhelmed me with joy. I am incredibly proud to be a student supported by the LSF scholarship. The scholarship is not only valuable financial aid but also serves as motivation for me to work harder in my studies and in life. The assistance I received included a laptop and financial support. Additionally, I have monthly meetings with my mentor from Lifestart Foundation, where I can discuss the challenges and stress I face in my studies and personal life. These interactions make me feel recognized and reduce my stress levels. Receiving the LSF scholarship, I'm now able to do what I could not do before when I had neither the living conditions nor financial resources, such as studying additional English classes or buying books. At the same time, the LSF scholarship also helps cover my living expenses and relieves the economic pressures of buying food, traveling, and paying for accommodation and electricity. As for my family, thanks to the LSF scholarship, I can help my parents with their family living expenses. My father had money to have joint treatment, and now his knees are much better than before. My mother was happier as some of the economic pressures for supporting me and the family were relieved. My brother also has a good condition to study.

I would like to thank the LSF scholarship for enabling me and my family to have a fuller, happier life. If I didn't have the support of this scholarship, I believe my life and my family's life would be incredibly difficult. I would always feel guilty because I couldn't help my parents, and I would be a burden that they have to provide for. Additionally, I wouldn't have the opportunity or means to study English or buy books to expand my knowledge. My parents wouldn't have money to afford necessary medical treatment. My mother would face more financial pressure and have to work even harder to generate income for the whole family.

Once again, I would like to extend my most sincere thanks and gratitude to Ms. Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation. I wish you all good health and success in life as well as in work. Hopefully, Lifestart Foundation will grow further and be able to help students in difficult circumstances like me to have a chance to improve their life. Thank you very much!

At Lifestart Foundation, **Education Scholarships** are our largest and most important project as we believe that education holds the key to breaking the poverty cycle for future generations. We also believe that nurturing and encouraging fine minds in particular in the health sector, we will help the development of Vietnam and its people.

Lifestart Foundation has continuously offered major medical and pharmacy scholarships to many outstanding students in Central Vietnam. Recently, we have awarded a new round of General Medicine Scholarships to outstanding candidates at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy.

Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy stands out as a top choice for aspiring doctors in Central Vietnam. We are extremely proud to be providing the most prestigious and highest value Medical Scholarships at this esteemed institution.

During the awards ceremony, 16 General Medicine scholarships were awarded to super impressive students who have demonstrated academic excellence and all hail from extremely underprivileged backgrounds. They have had to overcome enormous hardships to realize their dreams of studying medicine.

By way of their chosen vocation they also meet our criteria of completing a degree in an area that will not only benefit themselves and their families in the future but more importantly the wider community.

This round of scholarships totaled **\$250,000 AUD** (approximately VND 4.1 Billion), including financial aid for 16 General Medicine students and 4 Resident doctors who are completing their Masters and specialization, 8 new laptops for 8 students, and 1 English course.

Prior to receiving their Lifestart Foundation Medical Education Scholarships, many of our students struggled to afford their basic needs, including sufficient food and shelter. In addition to all tuition costs and books, their Lifestart Foundation scholarship provides them with a food and rent allowance which enables them to have a balanced nutritious daily diet and safe accommodation.

Since 2018 up to now, the total General Medicine and Pharmacy scholarships Lifestart Foundation offered to Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy through direct education scholarship program are 47 educational scholarships, 2 high achievement awards, 15 Master of nursing scholarships, and 4 residency scholarships, totaling over \$732,000 AUD (equivalent to more than VND 12 billion), this figure does not include the new laptops also provided to the students.



Through our scholarship program, we aspire not only to alleviate their financial constraints but also to empower them to unleash their full potential. This enables these students to continue their educational journey and fulfill their dreams of becoming highly educated healthcare professionals.

Once again, we warmly welcome this remarkable cohort of 16 General Medicine students into the Lifestart Foundation family and we are confident that they will continue to inspire us.

Recently, I successfully completed my final exams, which included two clinical subjects, Outpatient Pathology 5 and Internal Pathology 7, as well as my graduation thesis. The satisfaction is immense as I dedicated relentless effort to my studies, never once contemplating the thought of giving up. I'm delighted to share that my graduation thesis received an overall grade of A. The subject of my thesis was centered around the field of surgery, titled "Assessment of outcome of Medical Treatment and Quality of Life in Patients with Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia at Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy Hospital." The journey to completing my thesis spanned nearly eight months, marked by smooth progress owing to the enthusiastic guidance from my mentors and the invaluable support of peers and friends. Their worries were compounded by financial challenges and the responsibility of caring for me and my siblings. I vividly recall my mother meticulously recording expenses in her diary during my first year of university. The total amount, reaching 70 million dong, represented a substantial burden for my family. My mother's explanation was poignant: "I need to document this to remind myself to repay it next year." Gazing upon her handwritten notes, each number etched onto the page, my heart weighed heavily. Aware of my family's ongoing struggles, I understood that as long as I could cover tuition and sustain myself, it was more than sufficient. While I aspired to alleviate my parents' financial strain through part-time work, they discouraged the notion, fearing it could adversely impact my studies.

The connection I forged with Lifestart Foundation feels serendipitous. When I first held the scholarship application, a quiet hope stirred within me, anticipating a positive outcome. Fortuitously, I was selected to proceed to the interview stage, conducted at the Lifestart Foundation office in Hoi An, Quang Nam. The mixture of elation and trepidation preceding the interview remains vivid in my memory. I recall the overwhelming emotions I experienced while conversing with Ms. Karen and Ms. Nhung during the interview—a rare opportunity to share my journey with empathetic listeners. On my journey back home, I exhaled a sigh of relief. The day I received the scholarship offer coincided with my volunteer work at the hospital. Upon learning the news, my elation knew no bounds, and I wanted to shout with joy. I immediately phoned home to convey the news, and my parents' joy eclipsed even my own.

After a rigorous selection process, Duyen stood out as a compelling candidate and surpassed many other students in the interview round to receive this prestigious full Lifestart Foundation scholarship.

Despite her disadvantaged situation, Duyen has always excelled academically from primary school up to now. Her

excellent results were achieved thanks to her diligence and dedication to her studies. Duyen's GPA when she received the Lifestart Foundation scholarship was a remarkable 9.5 out of a possible 10, earning her the title of the most outstanding student in Year 9. As with all of our scholarship students, Duyen has a difficult backstory which she candidly explains in her letter of gratitude below.

Hailing from a large family with seven members, including her parents, her four siblings, and herself, Duyen's father works as a laborer while her mum sells scrap materials to make ends meet. They face the challenge of working very hard with unstable incomes. The education expenses for all five children are huge, contributing to the daily struggle of meeting the entire

family's living expenses. To add to their existing burdens, Duyen's younger sister suffers from a rare incurable eye disease. Every month, it costs the family approximately 2,000,000 VND or \$83 USD for medical check-ups and medicine for her. Like other Vietnamese children, Duyen dedicates 2 hours per day to assisting her parents with light household tasks such as washing clothes, washing dishes, and cleaning the house, in addition to her study time.

At this stage, Duyen harbors ambitious aspirations to become an accomplished doctor in the future to be able to support the community and especially to discover new drugs treating life-threatening diseases. We should never underestimate the importance of providing educational opportunities for young females in developing countries. Each girl who receives an education is one less vulnerable woman in the future.

Dear Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

I am Ho Thi Kieu Duyen, a student in Year 9 at Ngo Quyen Secondary School. I am writing to express my deep gratitude for the invaluable scholarship you have provided me with and to share more about my family, studies, and current life.

I come from a family of seven members, consisting of my parents, four siblings, and myself. My father used to be a fisherman, but due to the unstable income and hazardous conditions, he looked for more stable employment on land to support us. However, finding consistent work with reliable income has been a challenge, leading him to work as a freelance laborer, taking on various jobs that come his way. Presently, he is working on a construction project in Da Nang, which requires him to leave early in the morning. My mother, once a farmer, now earns her livelihood by selling scrap materials. This job is marked by its instability and unpredictability. Therefore, we carefully manage our meals and expenses, utilizing our resources wisely. This year's scorching weather has reminded me of the strenuous nature of my parents' work.

My eldest sister is a second-year university student majoring in Information Technology at Da Nang University of Technology. My second eldest sister is preparing for her twelfth year of education and has actively participated in the Academic Contest for Excellent Students, achieving commendable results. Despite her fragile health, my younger sister earned the title of Good Academic Performance in the third grade. Even my youngest sister, a first-grader, has been recognized for Excellent Academic Performance.

In year 9, I achieved an average of 9.5 out of 10 and secured the top rank in my class, a source of immense pride for me. I hold a strong interest in Chemistry, finding it captivating, while Mathematics is another subject where I excel. My school and class environment is incredibly supportive, with dedicated teachers and classmates. I am currently attending additional classes in Mathematics, Chemistry, and English. During the summer break, I dedicated five hours each

Tang comes from a multi-generational family in the coastal area of Quang Ngai Province. Their life was initially comfortable, but adversity struck when Tang's father was diagnosed with a stomach tumor and had to undergo surgery. Tang's mother also had to quit her job to accompany his father to Saigon for treatment. Since then, the family has faced immense hardships and pressure while trying to manage both the children's studies and the family's well-being. Receiving our scholarship was like a beacon of hope for Tang, and his life has become comparatively easier than ever before.

Tang is a shining example among the impoverished students who have received our scholarships, as he has successfully graduated and embarked on his career as a doctor.

TANG'S THANK-YOU LETTER:

Dear Ms Karen and everyone at Lifestart Foundation,

My name is Nguyen Hoang Cong Tang, a newly graduated student in General Medicine from Hue University of Medicine and Pharmacy academic year 2017 – 2023.

This is a time when I look back on my educational journey which has been filled with ups and downs. During my hard time in the past few years, I received support from Lifestart Foundation, where I could share my difficulties and stories, and I was listened to and advised by the staff at Lifestart Foundation. After each mentoring session, I was able to reflect on myself, gain a more accurate perspective, and overcome challenges in both my studies and daily life. Therefore, this letter is incredibly special to me even though it is not the first one I have written.

The second semester of my sixth year at University has been the most memorable period for me. This semester consisted solely of clinical courses, without any theoretical subjects. As a result, I had to dedicate a significant amount of time to studying and doing practical work at the hospital. The clinical exams were always challenging, putting pressure on me, but I was only achieving modest scores. Since my cumulative GPA was close to the good level mark, I made a great effort to read and listen to lectures extensively in hopes of achieving high marks in the clinical exams. Fortunately, I managed to pass both Obstetrics and Pediatrics with an average score of 3.5/4.0. I



was thrilled that my hard work paid off, and most importantly, I still had the opportunity to graduate with a Bachelor's degree with distinction.

I also finished the Graduation Examination, and I am happy with the results that exceeded my expectations. Throughout a month of exam preparation, studying a document of nearly 400 pages, it was truly a stressful time, and there were moments when I felt it was too difficult to achieve an excellent grade. I even sometimes contemplated giving up and accepting a credit degree. However, thanks to the encouragement from my mentors at Lifestart Foundation and friends, I regained my motivation and dedicated more time preparing for the exam.

When I received the results, I was genuinely surprised because I achieved an "A" level mark in all three subjects. I scored 9 out of 10 in the clinical exam, 9.2 out of 10 in the fundamental theory, and 8.6 in the clinical theory. My overall GPA for the second semester was 3.5 out of a possible 4.0, and my cumulative GPA for the entire six years of study was 3.24 out of 4.0. Hence, I could graduate with a distinction degree, and I am incredibly happy that my efforts have been rewarded. I am also delighted that I have lived up to the expectations of my family and Lifestart Foundation.

To be able to graduate, Hue Medical University students have to undergo a practical clinical internship in the central provinces. When I heard this news, I was truly excited because it was an opportunity to learn and gain deep insight into the healthcare system in my home province of Quang Ngai. My internship period at Quang Ngai General Hospital went very smoothly. I was fortunate to meet dedicated doctors and colleagues who were always enthusiastic in teaching and guiding me on my career path for the future.

Currently, I am focusing on the upcoming residency examination, which is very significant for all doctors. I realize that there are many talented individuals out there, and the pass rate may not be high. However, I am determined to study hard until the end because, for me, this is not just a competition, but also a challenge, a milestone that I must go through. Regardless of the outcome, I will still be proud of myself for being persistent, putting in all my effort, and, most importantly, overcoming my own fears.

As for where I want to work in the future, I haven't made any decision yet. If the results don't turn out as I hope, I have two options in mind. One is that I can choose to pursue an 18-month working certification at a hospital in Ho Chi Minh City, and the second one is that I can return to my hometown and seek employment at Quang Ngai General Hospital. For now, my main focus is on the residency examination. After the exam, I will take the time to research and make the most suitable choice for myself.

I remember the early days when I filled out the application for the Lifestart scholarship. I thought a lot about whether I deserved to receive the scholarship and whether my family's circumstances were truly difficult enough. I didn't want to take away opportunities from other students who might need help more than I did.

During that time, many things happened to my family, and the most challenging was when my father was diagnosed with a stomach tumor and had to undergo surgery. Our family had to spend money and even borrow to pay for his treatment. My mother had to quit her job to accompany my



father to Saigon for his treatment. This was the main reason why I decided to apply for the scholarship. I wanted to help my parents during that difficult time.

I was very nervous when going for the first interview at Lifestart, because I had to travel far and many other candidates were being interviewed. But the most important thing was that I had put a lot of effort and dedication into writing the scholarship application, so I was worried that I might not be selected. However, contrary to my thoughts during the travel time to the office, the interview session turned out to be very comfortable. Ms. Karen and Ms. Nhung were very friendly and open-minded, which made me feel more confident in answering the questions.

When I received the news that I had been awarded the scholarship, I was incredibly happy and proud. I immediately called home to share the news with my parents and sisters. Everyone was overjoyed and encouraged me to continue striving so as not to disappoint your expectations. Personally, I felt truly fortunate to have accomplished something that helped my parents during that difficult period.

The scholarship has greatly supported me in paying for tuition fees and daily expenses. Furthermore, beyond the financial assistance, Lifestart Foundation has also been a good listener who shared my hardships. Through conversations with my mentors, I have gained many things that have helped me establish a study plan and manage my time effectively.

If I didn't have the support of Lifestart at that time, perhaps I would have chosen to work part-time, and the fatigue from studying and working would have taken away my motivation back then, and I might have even failed and had to retake exams. Now, when I look back, I feel very lucky because both myself and my family have overcome everything, and Lifestart arrived just in time to help my family.

Finally, I would like to express my sincerest gratitude to the Lifestart Foundation, to Ms. Karen Leonard, and to all the people working at Lifestart. Having Lifestart accompany me on my journey as a student is an honor for me.

Thanks to the support of Lifestart, I have the strength to overcome difficulties in life and the motivation to go through the long and challenging path of being a student doctor. Even though I won't be able to continue with Lifestart Foundation, I believe that what I have received and learned will still be there, and it will help me greatly on the upcoming arduous journey to become a fully qualified doctor.

As my clinical sessions usually took place in the mornings and afternoons, I usually engaged in self-study during the evenings, except for the nights when I had to be on duty at the hospital. On a typical weekday, I dedicated approximately 4 hours to self-study. However, during weekends, if I were not on duty, I usually studied for about 8 hours per day.

As a final-year medical student, during the clinical exams, the lecturers focussed their questions on my clinical examination skills and diagnostic abilities. Fortunately, because I had practiced clinical examinations throughout my time at hospitals, I managed to pass the exams.

For my preparation for the graduation exam, I had a 4-week break dedicated to self-study. This period was undeniably intense, demanding a thorough understanding of both theoretical and clinical knowledge. It was, without a doubt, the most stressful examination period throughout my medical education. The graduation syllabus comprised 90 theoretical questions and a clinical exam. I invested a lot of time studying and revising, aiming to achieve a high score.

For the pre-graduation medical field trip, I chose to intern at Quang Tri Provincial General Hospital in the Paediatrics Department for a period of four weeks. Throughout this period, I attended



departmental meetings every morning. Then I would go on ward rounds with the main attending doctor. Before the rounds, I conducted patient examinations and reviewed their medical records. During the ward rounds, if I had any questions, the primary treating doctor would assist me and clarify my queries. I also had the opportunity to perform the procedure of inserting gastric tubes for newborn patients. The doctors and nurses in the Paediatrics department were incredibly supportive and helpful. This practical experience allowed me to apply the theoretical knowledge I had acquired, making the entire experience very enjoyable and enriching.

Besides my medical studies, I'm delighted to share that I have recently obtained my IELTS exam results, scoring 7.5. I am content with this achievement as I have been self-studying English for a significant time.

After a six-year journey, I completed my university studies with a Good degree, and I am confident that I performed to the best of my abilities.

Before receiving the scholarship from Lifestart Foundation, my family faced substantial financial hardships.

My father worked as a craftsman, and he also took on additional jobs such as electrical repairs. Unfortunately, he passed away suddenly in a traffic accident in 2017, leaving our family economically vulnerable. My mother's health was fragile, and she often fell ill. The family's main income depended on my mother's manual paper crafting work, which brought in only around 2 million VND per month.

I also worked part-time after classes to contribute to our daily living expenses taking on various jobs like tutoring and working at a handicraft store.

There were times when I contemplated pausing my education to support my family due to the extreme hardships. During this period, I also experienced depression after losing my father. My emotional instability made it incredibly challenging for me to concentrate on my studies; negative thoughts often distracted me from studying. My two younger brothers were still in high school, so they helped with household chores and the paper crafting work. Our family borrowed money from various sources to ensure that my two brothers and I could continue attending school.

During the process of preparing my application for the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, I put in considerable effort to prepare myself. I kept praying that I would be among the fortunate students to receive this scholarship, enabling me to continue my education.

When I received the invitation for an interview, I felt a mix of hope and anxiety. When I received the email informing me that I had been awarded the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, my family and I were overwhelmed with joy and happiness, especially my mother.

I was deeply moved and grateful for being chosen by Lifestart Foundation to receive this precious scholarship. The Lifestart Foundation scholarship has had an extremely positive impact on my life and my family.



Thanks to the substantial financial aid from the scholarship, I could cover my educational expenses and a portion of my living costs. This financial support has reduced the need for me to work excessively, allowing me to focus more on my studies.

As a result, my academic performance has significantly improved, and I have achieved excellent grades in the semesters after receiving the scholarship. I no longer had to worry excessively about earning money to pay for tuition fees, easing the burden on my mother.

Our family's financial situation has also become more stable since my mother no longer has to struggle to pay my tuition fees. Additionally, my mother's health has improved as she no longer has to constantly worry about the financial aspect of my education, especially covering the costs of my six-year university program.

I believe I wouldn't have been able to complete the six-year medical program without the support from the Lifestart Foundation scholarship, as my family's financial situation didn't allow for it. That's why I will always be grateful to the foundation for selecting me and granting me this valuable scholarship. It is thanks to this support that I have been fortunate enough to continue my education and pursue my dreams.

My family and I would like to express our sincere gratitude to you and everyone at Lifestart Foundation for accompanying me throughout these past years of my education. The support from you and Lifestart Foundation has been a tremendous source of motivation for me, encouraging me to strive to become a better version of myself each day.

It is due to the compassionate hearts of you and everyone at Lifestart Foundation that I have been able to complete my studies and fulfill my dream of becoming a doctor, and more importantly, pursue my aspiration of becoming a biomedical researcher.

I will continue to put my utmost efforts into both my professional career and postgraduate studies, aiming to become a valuable citizen contributing to society. My goal is to research and produce affordable test kits that all citizens can access and use. This endeavour will not only improve my own and my family's living conditions but also contribute positively to society.

I believe that words of gratitude are not enough to express my appreciation for what you and everyone at Lifestart Foundation have done for me during these past years of my education.

In closing, I would like to extend my heartfelt wishes to you and everyone at Lifestart Foundation for your good health, success, and the continued growth of the Foundation to help other students in challenging circumstances.

During the trip, the Lifestart Foundation team visited the Tra Don Semi-Boarding Ethnic Secondary School in Nam Tra My district and donated 100 food hamper boxes, containing essential items of rice, cooking oil, fish sauce, washing powder, shampoo, toothpaste, and dishwashing liquid. The total value of the donations exceeded 42,000,000 VND or approximately \$1,800 USD. This round, we distributed bikes to disadvantaged students at Phan Chau Trinh Secondary School. This school was selected for this initiative because it is located in the rural Song Kon Commune of Dong Giang District. The school has 186 students, 90 percent of whom are from the Cotu ethnic minority. Most of these students come from poor families and face enormous hardships.

These students who were provided with new bikes are all from underprivileged families and previously did not have any means of transportation to travel to and from school due to their difficult financial situations. Living in remote villages, some as far as 9-10 kilometers away, these determined students faced exhausting journeys daily.

Before receiving the much-needed bicycles, many of these students had to walk for a long distance or rely on their friends to give them a lift to school and extra classes every day. When they heard the good news that they were going to receive a bicycle from Lifestart Foundation, they all were very thrilled and appreciative.

By providing bicycles, these students can now travel to school safely, ensuring punctuality and regular attendance in classes. This improvement in transportation not only maximizes their learning potential but also creates additional study opportunities due to reduced travel time.

Additionally, as part of our initiative, we also provided 60 hamper boxes of household necessities to 60 students from extremely challenging circumstances and more than 120 reference books for the students and the school's library. The total cost of the whole donation exceeded \$2,000 USD (approximately 50,000,000 VND).
